## 2015 ARUNDEL MUSEUM AWARDS...

In 2015 Arundel Museum applied for two building design awards that were gratefully endorsed by the Worthing Society and which in both cases resulted in a positive result. These were:-

### CIVIC VOICE AWARD

The Civic Voice is the new umbrella organisation for the Civic movement in England following the closure of the Civic Trust in 2009. In their first awards competition Arundel Museum was successful in obtaining a Highly Commended Award in the New Buildings Category which was the most competitive section of all. For all categories there were 62 entries and the Museum was one of only 12 that received an award in this national competition.

The citation stated that the Museum is a huge community achievement, praised for its considered response both to local and visitor need and to its setting and history. Also that the project has maximised available space and worked within a limited budget to achieve a high quality and efficient design which reached out to the community and impresses with its social and environmental sustainability
